

From palatial houses by the sea to cabins in the woods and off-grid retreats, Richard Mellor picks the best escapes

COASTAL

1 Swanky Devon pad

Hidden by trees above north Devon's coast, luxury Linea, near Combe Martin, is as unique as holiday homes come. It's geometric with glass exterior walls, under a tilting roof with minimalist interiors, including the odd modern art print. Light pours into the five huge bedrooms and, in the sofa area, views of the sea stretch to the horizon giving a sense of being enveloped by nature. Saunter along the South West Coast Path to Ilfracombe or lounge by the heated infinity pool outside.

2 Family beach house in Kent

You'll find free prosecco and homemade jam waiting at Whitstable Beach House, a terraced seafront cottage. The owners have also employed natty design touches a model ship and hanging plant here, herringbone floors and iron-rail beds there. With room to sleep six in two double bedrooms and a mezzanine nook, it's perfect for families, with paddleboarding on offer from Whitstable's shingle beach. 3 Cottage in Suffolk

Visitors to the coastal village of Orford are spoilt for choice. They can climb Orford Castle's polygonal keep, go crabbing off the nearby quay, treat themselves to goods in the award-winning Pump Street Bakery, cruise up the River Alde or look for Chinese water deer in Orford Ness. Riverside Ferry Cottage is the ideal base from which to do all that, or to relax in its large, rose-flanked garden with its summer house and sun-soaked conservatory.
